Alison Gregory Named Director of Library Services at Lycoming College

Williamsport, PA—Alison S. Gregory has been named Lycoming College's Associate Dean and Director of Library Services at the John G. Snowden Memorial Library, according to an announcement by Dr. Phil Sprunger, Provost and Dean of the college. She began her duties July 1, having served the college since 2005 as Assistant Professor and Instructional Services Librarian and Coordinator of Information Literacy and Outreach. She is replacing Janet McNeil Hurlbert, who retired at the conclusion of the 2012-13 academic year.

Gregory hopes to continue collaborating with faculty to help improve students' research assignments as well as teaching students how to conduct research. "We are a teaching library," she said. "And to be a good director, I still need to be hands-on in the library classroom." Also as of July 1, she was promoted from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor.

Additionally, she is a mentee within the Association of College and Research Libraries' (ACRL) College Director's Mentor Program.
